

#### Current Information on Zika Virus

Last Updated: 16 July 2018

Zika virus disease is caused by the Zika virus, which is spread to people primarily through the bite of an infected mosquito (Aedes aegypti and Aedes albopictus). The virus can also be transmitted through sex. While most people who get infected have no symptoms, of those who do get ill, the most common symptoms are fever, rash, joint pain, and red eyes. The illness is usually mild with symptoms lasting from several days to a week. Severe disease requiring hospitalization is uncommon.

In early 2016, there was a rise in the spread of Zika virus in Brazil which was accompanied by an unprecedented rise in the number of children being born with microcephaly. In addition, several countries reported a steep increase in Guillain-Barre syndrome. Based on a systematic review of the scientific literature, the WHO concluded that Zika virus infection during pregnancy is a cause of congenital brain abnormalities, including microcephaly, and is also a trigger of Guillain-Barre syndrome. Zika continues to spread geographically to areas where mosquitoes are present that can transmit the virus. To date, multiple countries or territories have reported microcephaly and other central nervous system (CNS) malformations potentially associated with Zika infections, or suggestive of congenital infection according to the WHO. Currently, the WHO is investigating these associations with the Zika Virus Research Agenda.

In light of these events, the UN Medical Services Division (MSD), as an occupational health service with an obligation to manage occupational exposure to harm for UN personnel, has developed a comprehensive set of recommendations for specified risk categories, including pregnant and non-pregnant UN personnel and dependents who reside in, or plan to travel into any areas with Zika virus transmission as listed below. This risk mitigation plan as found below will be updated as new information and guidance become available.

Women who are seeking pregnancy should obtain individual advice from their medical practitioner on risk management regarding their plans to travel into such areas.
